Symphony no. 85 by Joseph Haydn is named “la Reine” (the Queen). From this symphony the second movement is a nice Romance. It is not difficult at all, but care has to be taken to play the series of grace notes correctly. There are a lot of repeats, which makes this movement long and repetitive. The whole movement takes about 7:30 min, but if you omit all repeats it is only about 4 minutes. The arrangement can be played by a quintet without difficulty, but a larger ensemble can use *diviso* to make it sound better. (For instance, an LMH or 16-8-4 register can be replaced by separating it into LM and MH or 16-8 and 8-4 which emphasizes the M (8) a bit better.

A recording by Professor P is available on YouTube. This is a quintet recording (no *diviso* anywhere).
